Absentee/Mail-in ballots

Voters coming in that have an **Absentee or Mail-in ballot**, which is **filled out**, **cannot be accept by the Judge of elections or any poll worker**. They have to take their filled out Absentee/Mail-in ballot to the drop-off box at voter registration before 8pm on Election Day, November 3, 2020.

If they did not fill it out or do not want to fill it out, they have to surrender it to the judge of elections and fill out a form, Elector's Declaration to Surrender Their Mail Ballot to be able to vote at the poll. Everything must be turned into the judge of elections:

- 1. The envelope it was mailed to them in.
- 2. The return envelope.
- 3. The official election envelope.
- 4. The ballot.
- 5. The instruction sheet

The judge of elections will spoil that absentee/mail-in ballot and give the person an Official Ballot or the person may vote on the ICX machine which is an Official Ballot when printed off.

If they applied for an Absentee/Mail-in ballot and want to vote **but do not have the absentee/mail-in ballot** with them they **have to vote a provisional ballot**.
